REMEMBER:

1. EVERY time you want a different font, you need to open a font tag and then close it again at the end.
2. Put each tag on a new line so that it is easier for us to follow our own coding and find any mistakes that we might make.
3. Your computer can only interpret and use fonts that have already been loaded on it, so you could easily do something at school, but when you look at it somewhere else, it looks different.
4. "Times New Roman" is the default (in other words, the computer will choose this one if it does not have the one you chose ... or if you made ANY coding or spelling error
5. In addition to tags < > </ > you will also need to use quotations " "
